# Positive Indian Parenting Facilitator Training

**Details:** Thanks to funding from the *Department of Social and Health Services' Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery*, this training is free for attendees! Lunches, refreshments, and training materials will be provided. Attendees will be responsible for their own transportation, lodging & meals outside of the training.

**All individuals interested in becoming facilitators are invited, including:** Tribal program staff, Tribal Members, or residents in Tribal Communities within Washington State. Parenting / family service providers, and Community Wellness and Prevention Initiative (CPWI) staff or coalition members are also invited. Priority registration will be given to tribal members and people who live with and work with tribal communities.

If you work with tribal youth and/or families and have a desire to learn about Traditional Native American child rearing techniques, this training is for you! At the completion of the training, attendees will be certified to facilitate the Positive Indian Parenting curriculum.

**Pre-Registration Required:** Training is limited to 20 participants. Registration is first come, first serve and is free. **Registration deadline is Wednesday, June 6<sup>th</sup>**.
