<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If there are any changes to the information, the agricultural employer must be provided with updated information prior to the application. If changes occur at time of application, the commercial pesticide handler employer must provide updated information to the agricultural employer within two hours after completing the application. Changes to the estimated application end time of less than one hour need not be reported to the agricultural employer. • The pesticide application and hazard information for each pesticide product applied must be displayed no later than 24 hours after the end of the application of the pesticide. HOWEVER: Workers cannot enter any area where a pesticide has been applied until (1) the applicable pesticide application and hazard information for each pesticide product applied to that area is displayed <u>and</u> (2) after the restricted-entry interval has expired and all treated area warning signs have been removed or covered. • The pesticide application and hazard information must be displayed continuously from the beginning of the display period until at least 30 days after the end of the last applicable restricted-entry interval, or until workers or handlers are no longer on the establishment, whichever is earlier.
